
Message from the National Chaplain

SS. Cyril and Methodius Appeal

The Saints Cyril and Methodius Appeal is in its 45th year raising money to assist the Pontifical Slovak College of Saints Cyril and Methodius in Rome with its day-to-day operations. The Appeal relies upon the generosity of individual donors in addition to collections taken up in personal parishes of Slovak ancestry. A direct mailing asking for donations was sent in January to local district and branch leaders from the four Catholic Slovak Fraternal Organizations, members of the Slovak Catholic Federation, clergy with Slovak ancestry, and previous donors.

As of April 29, the 2023 Appeal has received \$18,967 from 157 donors. Among the 45 donations received from Catholic Slovak Fraternal Branches and Districts, Branch 3, Branch 35, Branch 85, Branch 96, Branch 112, Branch 153, Branch 213, Branch 450, Branch 484, Branch 743, Branch 746, Branch 856, District 16, and the Home Office of the First Catholic Slovak Union have donated a combined total of \$3,425. Donations to

date have also been received from 5 parishes, 27 clergy and religious, and 80 individuals. On behalf of the Pontifical College, thank you for your continued generosity and support.

All wishing to contribute to the 2023 Appeal is asked to fill out the information in the box at the bottom of this article and mailing it along with your check payable to the Slovak Catholic Federation to the address provid-Donations in any amount are deeply appreciated and are acknowledged. Gifts received after November 30, 2023 will be credited toward the 2024 Appeal. Thank you again for your goodness and generosity.

The Jednota Branch 746 Scholarship was established to award a one-time \$1,500 scholarship to eligible First Catholic Slovak Union Branch 746 members to assist them with the educational pursuits. In order to apply, please complete the following steps.

The application deadline is **June 30**th. Scholarship awards will be announced by September 1st. Applicants who do not meet the minimum criteria will not be considered for a scholarship but are encouraged to re-apply at a future date.

Jednota Branch 746 Scholarship eligibility:

- Member of Branch 746 with paid up life insurance premium of \$5,000 or more;
- Of Slovak descent and Catholic faith;
- Currently accepted and/or enrolled in full-time college, another post-secondary educational institution, or vocational institution;
- High school senior student through junior year of college, post-secondary and/or vocational institution.

Application criteria:

Applicants will be required to describe accomplishments they believe would qualify them for recognition in general, and specifically, accomplishments in the areas of:

- Scholarship
- Leadership
- Service to school, church and community
- Involvement in Jednota Branch 746 (applicant should have attended at minimum one meeting and/or event in the current or previous calendar the year of application)

Applicants will be required to:

- 1. Submit a copy of your high school, college, or vocational institution transcript of grades;
- 2. Provide one (1) letter of recommendation authored by a teacher, counselor, administrator or an employment supervisor familiar with the applicant;
- 3. Compose an essay (minimum 250 words) describing your background; community involvement; scholastic excellence; leadership ability; and career objectives;
- 4. Submit a copy of paid-up life insurance of \$5,000 or more or letter from home office confirming such contract.

District 4 Roots for the NJ Devils!



District 7 Meeting in Wilmore, PA

The Rev. John Martvon District 7 held its semi-annual meeting at St. Bartholomew Church Hall in Wilmore, PA on April 30. 2023. The District is named after Rev. John Martvon (1857-1948), a Slovak immigrant from Hruštín, Námestovo, Slovakia. He originally served at St. Ladislas Roman Catholic Church in Cleveland's Buckeye neighborhood. After going back to Slovakia in 1893, he returned to the United States in 1894 and served as pastor at St. Stephen's Slovak Catholic Church in Johnstown, Pennsylvania. During the 1940s and 1950s, St. Stephen was the largest Slovak Catholic parish in the USA. When he died at age 91 in 1948, he was at the time the oldest priest in the country.



Poľnohospodári sú kvôli ukrajinským importom v ťažkej situáci

Bratislava 17. apríla (TASR) - Slovenskí poľnohospodári a potravinári si uvedomujú, že obmedzenie dovozu niektorých komodíť musí podliehať vzájomnej koordinácii s Bruselom. Nachádzajú sa však v tak mi-moriadne závažnej situácii, ktorá by bez zavedenia zákazu negatívne vplývala na stabilitu trhov a znižovala konkurencieschopnosť našich firiem. Po ohlásení zákazu dovozu niektorých komodít z Ukrajiny to uviedla Slovenská poľnohospodárska a potravinárska komora (SPPK).



"Na jednej strane si plne uvedomujeme, že

obmedzenie dovozov musí podliehať vzájomnej koordinácii s Bruselom. Na strane druhej sa však momentálne nachádzame v tak mimoriadne závažnej situácii, že bez zavedenia takejto formy reštrikcie by sme spôsobovali nové straty slovenským pestovateľom s dosahom na stabilitu trhov a znižovanie konkurencieschopnosti našich firiem," uviedla hovorkyňa SPPK Jana Holéciová.

SPPK zároveň vyzvala pestovateľov, aby sa snažili čím skôr minuloročné obilie odpredať a uvoľniť tak sklady novej úrode, ktorú budú zbierať už o pár mesiacov.

UNESCO podporí projekt SR na ochranu kultúrneho dedičstva Ukrajiny

Bratislava 13. apríla (TASR) – Ľudia násilne vysídlení z Ukrajiny, ktorí našli útočisko na Slovensku, budú mať príležitosť stretávať sa na špeciálnych podujatiach venovaných ich tradíciám a kultúrnemu dedičstvu. Poskytne im to projekt, ktorý vypracoval Ústav etnológie a sociálnej antropológie Slovenskej akadémie vied (SAV) v súčinnosti s Ministerstvom kultúry (MK) SR. "Sumou 100.000 eur ho podporilo UNESCO," informoval rezort kultúry.

Cieľom programu je ochrana nehmotného kultúrneho dedičstva ukrajinských komunít žijúcich na Slovensku a zvýšenie všeobecného povedomia o dôležitej úlohe živého dedičstva v prostredí násilím presídlených komunít. Na tvorbe programu sa podieľali aj samotní ukrajinskí občania, ktorí utiekli pred vojnou.

"Výsledkom iniciatívy bude séria workshopov a oslavy tradičných sviatkov, ktoré budú zamerané na zdieľanie ukrajinského živého kultúrneho dedičstva. Špeciálna pozornosť bude venovaná ženám, deťom, staršej populácii a znevýhodneným skupinám," dodal rezort kultúry.

Projekt, ktorého trvanie sa odhaduje na 20 mesiacov, sa bude realizovať na celom Slovensku, väčšina aktivít však bude realizovaná v Bratislave, kde sídli majorita odídencov z Ukrajiny.

Jeden z najvýraznejších filmových tvorcov Dušan Hanák má 85 rokov

Bratislava 27. apríla (TASR) - Dušan Hanák je autorom výnimočných dokumentárnych a hraných filmov s osobitou autentickou výpoveďou, v ktorých prepájal experimentovanie s civilnosťou. Keďže jeho diela nespĺňali ideové kritériá vtedajšieho socialistického umenia, neraz boli pre verejnosť na dlhšiu dobu zakázané. Napriek ťomu sa filmy významného umelca napokon dočkali uznania nielen na Slovensku, ale aj v zahraničí.



Jeden z najvýraznejších filmových

tvorcov slovenskej kinematografie 20. storočia, režisér a scenárista Dušan Hanák sa vo štvrtok 27. apríla dožíva 85 rokov.

Dušan Hanák sa narodil 27. apríla 1938 v Bratislave. V rokoch 1960 – 1965 študoval réžiu na Filmovej a televíznej fakulte Akadémie múzických umení (FAMU) v Prahe. Ako režisér a scenárista pôsobil v rokoch 1964 – 1991 v Slovenskej filmovej tvorbe v Bratislave. Už počas vysokoškolských štúdií nakrútil krátke snímky ako napríklad Alcron (1963), 6 otázek pro Jana Wericha (1963) alebo Učenie (1965).

Do profesionálneho filmového sveta vstúpil ako nádejný dokumentarista. V diele Prišiel k nám Old Shatterhand (1966) s ľahkosťou, humorom a iróniou zachytil život v socialistickom Československu v 60. rokoch minulého storočia. V krátkometrážnom filme Omša (1967) zaznamenal bohoslužbu v Spišskej Sobote s autentickými liturgickými textami a spevmi.

Farmers are in a difficult situation because of Ukrainian imports

Bratislava, April 17 (TASR) - Slovak farmers and food producers are aware that the restriction of the import of certain commodities must be subject to mutual coordination with Brussels. However, they are in such an extremely serious situation that, without the introduction of the ban, it would negatively affect the stability of the markets and reduce the competitiveness of our companies. This was announced by the Slovak Department of Agriculture and Food (SPPK) after the ban on the import of certain commodities from Ukraine was announced.

"On the one hand, we are fully aware that the restriction of imports must be subject to mutual coordination with Brussels. On the other hand, however, we are currently in such an extremely serious situation that without the introduction of such a form of restriction, we would cause new losses to Slovak growers with an impact on the stability of markets and reducing the competitiveness of our companies," said SPPK spokeswoman Jana Holéciová.

At the same time, SPPK called on growers to try to sell last year's grain as soon as possible to

free up storage for the new crop, which will be harvested in a few months.

At its online meeting on Monday, the government approved a ban on the import of Ukrainian grain and some agricultural commodities from Ukraine from April 19, but not their transit through Šlovakia.

UNESCO will support the SR project to protect the cultural heritage of Ukraine

Bratislava, April 13 (TASR) - People forcibly displaced from Ukraine who found refuge in Slovakia will have the opportunity to meet at special events dedicated to their traditions and cultural heritage. This will be provided by a project developed by the Institute of Ethnology and Social Anthropology of the Slovak Academy of Sciences (SAV) in cooperation with the Ministry of Sciences (SAV) at the Slovak Beautilia #UN Culture (MK) of the Slovak Republic. "UN-



ESCO supported it with the sum of 100,000 euros," informed the Department of Culture.

The aim of the program is to protect the intangible cultural heritage of Ukrainian communities living in Slovakia and to increase general awareness of the important role of living heritage in the environment of forcibly displaced communities. Ukrainian citizens themselves who fled the war participated in the creation of the program.

"The result of the initiative will be a series of workshops and celebrations of traditional holidays aimed at sharing Ukraine's living cultural heritage. Special attention will be paid to women, children, the elderly population and disadvantaged groups," the Ministry of Culture added.

The project, whose duration is estimated at 20 months, will be implemented throughout Slovakia, but most of the activities will be implemented in Bratislava, where the majority of emigrants from Ukraine live.

One of the most prominent filmmakers, Dušan Hanák, is 85 years old

Bratislava, April 27 (TASR) - Dušan Hanák is the author of exceptional documentary and feature films with a unique authentic narrative, in which he linked experimentation with civility. Since his works did not meet the ideological criteria of socialist art at the time, they were often banned from the public for a long time. Despite this, the films of the important artist finally received rec-

ognition not only in Slovakia, but also abroad.

One of the most prominent filmmakers of Slovak cinematography of the 20th century, director and screenwriter Dušan Hanák, turned 85 on Thursday, April 27.

Dušan Hanák was born on April 27, 1938 in Bratislava. Between 1960 and 1965, he studied directing at the Film and Television Faculty of the Academy of Performing Arts (FAMU) in Prague. He worked as a director and screenwriter in the years 1964 – 1991 at Slovak Film Production in Bratislava. Already during his university studies, he shot short films such as Alcron (1963), 6 questions for Jan Werich (1963) or Learning (1965).

He entered the professional film world as a promising documentary filmmaker. The work "Old Shatterhand Came to Us" (1966) captured life in socialist Czechoslovakia in the 1960s with lightness, humor, and irony. In the short film "Mass" (1967), he recorded the service in Spišská Sobota with authentic liturgical texts and chants.

A Young Slovak Doing Humanitarian Work for Ukraine

Joseph Beno of Branch 743 in Sterling Heights, Michigan, recommended that I talk with Marek Janiga, a humanitarian worker volunteering for the Slovak Catholic Charity (Caritas). Thus, we had a three-way conversation on March 24, 2023, which is summarized here.

Although he lived in Michigan, Janiga was born in Veličná, Slovakia, a village in Orava, near Dolný Kubin. His mother is a university professor his father was a mayor. He is 19 years-old and a student of law at the Comenius University in Bratislava. He also does work for the Department of State, Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs.

The Ukrainian war and its consequences for people motivated him and others to want to do something personally to relieve people's suffering in Ukraine. After the Russians invaded Ukraine, he organized a benefit piano recital in the Saint Cyril and Methodius Slovak Catholic Church while living in Sterling Heights. Then his brother hooked him up with Caritas, Slovak Catholic Charities.

So, Marek moved back to Slovakia and is currently busy helping the Ukrainians and doing some dangerous work at times. He has spent more than a month in Ukraine and has made six humanitarian trips to Ukraine to help. In fact, he left for a seventh trip taking supplies to Ukraine just a few days after our conversation. When he returns to Slovakia, he gives presentations, interviews, and writes articles about the situation in Ukraine.

In our discussion, we asked what do people of Ukraine think about the outside help? He stated that a common misconception caused by misinformation concerns discrimination or even genocide of the Russian people in Donbass. About 80 percent of the people in Kharkiv speak Russian as their native language, and it is only 30 minutes from the Russian border. Some people in the city and many in the surrounding villages do not speak Ukrainian at all.

He visited the second-largest city (1.5 million

The Catholic priest Ján Hollý was an exceptional poet, a translator of ancient Greek and Latin, a scholar, and a great personality of the Slovak nation. He was honored on April 14, 2023, by the laying of wreaths on his grave in Dobrá Voda on the occasion of the 174th anniversary of his death. Performing the honors were Daniel Suchá, president of the civic association CYRILO-METODIADA, and Irena Ciutti, whose father was a Dobrá Voda native and the parish priest in Hrachovište. Despite the two centuries that separate us from his life, his work and work are still part of our national and cultural existence. He sang about the soul of our people and the beauty of our homeland in Bernolák's Slovak. In his epics, he drew from the rich history of our nation and brought to light its ancient glory and the exceptional personalities who stood out during its spiritual birth.

Background Information On Slovak Day

Slovaks are a large part of the tapestry that has helped form Western Pennsylvania.

For 100 years, Slovaks of Western Pennsylvania have gathered at Kennywood Park to bring together family and friends to celebrate their Slovak heritage. In the early years, Slovaks in America had a difficult time. They had to contend with language barriers, low incomes, difficult travel since there were just a few cars, telephones not readily accessible, and most importantly there was separation from family and friends. In order to help the Slovak immigrants assimilate into American culture, twenty eight Slovak parishes were formed in Western Pennsylvania. Those parishes worked together to help educate, support, and celebrate their faith. They felt it would be great to gather Slovaks together to celebrate their Slovak heritage and their new American home. Kennywood was a natural for the celebration: it had picnic grounds, rides for the kids and a place for them to gather. So on July 8, 1924 the first Slovak Day was inaugurated at Kennywood Park.

Slovak Day has for 100 years consecutively celebrated their ethnic heritage through the Great Depression, World War II, Korean War, Vietnam War, and the pandemic. Through the years the Slovaks have put Tradition, Community, Family and Faith at the heart of its celebration.

Tradition included the food they prepare. Many of the recipes are as old as the celebration. The music, song and dance performance are provided by the Pittsburgh Slovakians and The Pittsburgh Area Slovak Folk Ensemble (PAS). Many Slovak folk bands have also provided music for listening and dancing.

There are displays of Slovak culture along with speakers who have enhanced the festivities.

Community participation has always been a part of the day. Slovak Day has engaged itself in selling War Bonds during WWII, projects for Veterans, being a Member of the Sister Cities project, and ongoing support for the religious and the cultural communities.

Family and friends have always been at the center of Slovak Day with dancing and singing, picnic baskets, and games for the kids.

In the early days attendance at mass in the morning of Slovak Day was part of the day's routine. After mass, parishioners would proceed to the park in their village dress. This was the norm until the 1940's when Mass was brought into the park in Slovak . The Mass continues to be celebrated at the Park in English but the hymns are sung in Slovak.

Slovak Day has evolved since that first day in 1924 when the first generation Slovak immigrants could freely speak their language and express their culture. The Slovak Churches and priests that promoted Slovak Heritage have greatly diminished. The spirit continues, however, of being proud of our heritage and belief in the American dream prevails. We look forward to celebrating the 100th Anniversary of Slovak Day July 20, 2023 a Kennywood Park.

LIGHT ONE CANDLE In the Footsteps of Mary

This year, Mother's Day falls on Sunday, May 14, just one day after the Feast of Our Lady of Fatima. Together, these two days make up a special weekend in this month already dedicated to our Blessed Mother. It is fitting that our celebrations of motherhood and Mary coincide because she is the guardian of mothers in this world. Mary is the model for motherhood in both joy and sorrow, and she shows the way of mercy at all times.

The story of Mary standing at the foot of the cross resonates with mothers in their deepest moments of suffering. When Jesus said to Mary, "Woman, behold, your son!" He was entrusting her to the care of John. He followed that by saying to John, "Behold, your mother!" So, He was entrusting John to her care as well, and by extension, He was entrusting us all to Mary's care.

The numerous and well-documented Marian apparitions that have occurred over the years confirm Mary's role as mother to us all and her profound connection to God. Credible Marian apparitions have occurred in many cultures at important moments in history, and the apparitions at Fatima remain among the most astounding.

Mary's final apparition at Fatima made international news, and it was reported that somewhere between 30,000 and 100,000 people made pilgrimages to the Cova da Iria, a field where Lucia dos Santos and her cousins Francisco and Jacinta Marto pastured their families' sheep. There, the pilgrims witnessed Mary's promised sign as the sun broke through dark rain clouds and defied the laws of physics, dancing in the sky and, at one point, appearing to fall to earth before finally returning to its normal position, leaving the ground the people were standing on and their previously wet clothes completely dry.

In her appearances to Lucia, Francesco, and Jacinta, Mary asked for prayers, reparations, and devotion to her Immaculate Heart, and she made statements about war and peace that proved prophetic throughout the 20th century. At every turn, her intervention at Fatima was marked by a profound care for humanity and the hope that we would follow Christ and discover the Mercy of God.

Mary's role as the mother of Jesus is the lens through which to understand why she is such a powerful intercessor for us. Consider the story of the Wedding at Cana, when Jesus turned water into wine at His mother's request. Midway through the gathering, she said to Him, "They have no wine," and Jesus answered, "O woman, what have you to do with me? My hour has not yet come." At this point, Mary turned to the servants and said, "Do whatever He tells you."

What amazing confidence Mary had that Jesus would do as she asked even after He expressed displeasure at the request. This is the type of confidence we should have in asking for Mary's intercession because she will always bring our needs to the foot of the cross where all good things have been made possible in Christ.

In His actions at the Wedding at Cana, Jesus demonstrates the tremendous loyalty and respect we all owe to our mothers, who walk in the footsteps of Mary in the countless selfless acts they perform on our behalf. We should turn to the intercession of Mary to ask Christ to bless us with the same devotion to our mothers that He showed to His, so we can honor them this Mother's Day and throughout our lives.

The Ascension of the Lord

Lectionary 58, Gospel Matthew 28: 16-28

Why did our Lord depart from us and ascend to the Father? This is a question which I have been asked several times and which Christians from the earliest days of the Church have asked. The question makes sense: after all, if Christ truly loves his people and desires salvation for them, would he not remain with us following his resurrection in order to accompany us? As St. Paul tells us "We know that Christ, raised from the dead, dies no more; death no longer has power over him" (Rom 6:9). Does it not seem natural that believers of all eras would say to him, if they could, what the disciples on the road to Emmaus said the very day of Jesus' resurrection—"Stay with us, Lord!" (Luke 24:29).

Given all of that it is important to understand why the Lord departed from us and returned to the Father. He did so first so that his human existence which began with the incarnation might be brought to completion. When a person dies they are no longer physically present to us, though they may be present in spirit. It is true that when Jesus died he did in fact return to his earthly disciples briefly after the resurrection—a unique event in human history—to show himself as risen and to teach them further. But he then

departed since it is not the course of human nature to continue on this earth after death; that is the existence of a ghost rather than a human being.

His ascension also has a "divine dimension": returning to the Father was the natural state for the Son who in his human nature is known as Jesus, and so after his earthly life was complete and he had reassured the disciples that he was truly risen it is to be expected by his faithful that the Son should depart: "If you loved me, you would rejoice that I am going to the Father" (John 14:28).

Going further we can say that Jesus ascended to the Father so that through faith we might freely choose to follow him and thereby come to the fullness of our own human dignity and come to salvation. Saint John addresses this in recording the words of the Lord when he spoke to Thomas: "Have you come to believe because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed" (John 20:29). Saint Paul agrees, writing to the Corinthians: "We know that while we are at home in the body we are away from the Lord, for we walk by faith, not by sight" (2 Cor 5:6-7).

Using the God given gifts of our intellect and will we can make this free choice, freely doing the will of the Father



like Christ, freely becoming more like ultation at the right hand of the Father. Christ who perfectly obeys the will of the Father, and freely being transformed into the image and likeness of God in which we were originally made (Gen 1:26-27). Doing so we fulfill the will of our heavenly Father just as Jesus himself fulfilled God's will through the mystery of his incarnation, death, and resurrection.

The Ascension of Christ thus brings before us the glorious mystery of Christ's victory over sin and death and his ex-

At the same time it invites us to use the beautiful gift of freedom, itself a reflection of God's nature, to choose to draw ever nearer to the One in whose image we were made and to whose image we are destined to return. Today let us rejoice in the knowledge that Christ is risen and ascended to the Father-the Father to whom we too will return when our human nature is united to his divinity.

people before the war) on five occasions and saw destroyed neighborhoods and a non-functioning city. The Russians were in the city in the first days of the war. He was in the city already in July when the Russian army was only 15 kilometers from the city. The holes where bombs fell were visible. Until 2014, many people saw Russians as natural brothers, and hoped for cooperation, but all has changed, and now only very few people, mostly in their 80s are more pro-Russian and gave vague answers. Almost everyone wants the Russians to go away for

When he went to Kharkiv, nothing was functioning in the city and Russians were just 15 minutes away. They helped a local charity, Caritas Spes-Kharkiv. Several vans arrived from Slovakia, and they united with other charitable volunteers. They needed to coordinate because of security. With a chain of cars of

local volunteers, they brought mostly food and medications, baby products, blankets, and water to the northernmost district of Kharkiv called Saltivka that was under Russian shelling at the

time. About 3,000 people lined up in a long line.
How many Slovaks are involved? He said that many people helping/collecting aid at home and dozens of Slovaks are driving with aid back and forth. It is a 20-hour drive to deliver the aid to eastern Ukraine, going through many military checkpoints. Since the beginning of the war, Slovak Catholic Charity has delivered 900 tons of humanitarian aid. In the beginning, they used to send trucks with 200,000 euros worth of supplies, but now they are short of money because popular support has been declining because of donor's fatigue.

When asked if there is a story that describes best what is happening, he replied that the hardest thing is to see the children, who suffer and dream and hope for a brighter future. One particular child, 8-year-old Inha, used to go to

If citizens in the USA wants to help sending material, what can they do? He suggested finding a person or an organization that you trust and can see the results of your contribution. Things often get lost if given to a non-verified person. Sending material aid from the US is not worth it because the prices are much lower there. Organizations like Caritas provide humanitarian aid not military agripment and all manitarian aid, not military equipment, and all those materials can be bought in Europe.

He did relate that Ukraine still has prob-

lems with corruption and a black market, at a high level and at the local level. If given to a non-trusted person, it happens that the aid "gets lost" in someone's cellar. The military is very strict about enforcement, security, and thefts in the conflict areas.

A network helps organize where help goes. In Kharkiv, three Polish priests help the Ukrainian Catholic Charity assist in telling where some-

thing in needed. He left again on the last Wednesday in March and would be gone 6-7 days, and when he returned, he planned on making yet another run to Ukraine. Such is his dedication and that of many other Slovaks.

V roku 1969 Dušan Hanák debutoval celovečerným filmom 322, v ktorom hlavný hrdina v spojitosti s vlastnou vážnou diagnózou prehodnocuje svoj doterajší život a hodnoty. Psychologická dráma napriek komunistickej cenzúre v Československu získala Veľkú cenu na Medzinárodnom filmovom festivale (MFF) v Mannheime. Vo filme okrem viacerých nehercov účinkovali aj poprední českí a slovenskí herci Václav Lohniský, Josef Abrhám, Miroslav Macháček, František Zvarík či poľská herečka Lucyna Winnicka.

Veľký úspech režisér zaznamenal aj dokumentom Obrazy starého sveta (1972), ktorý patrí medzi najvýznamnejšie filmy slovenskej kinematografie. Uznania sa však dočkal až po rokoch, pretože kvôli ideovým a estetickým kritériám bol na istú dobu zaradený k tzv. trezorovým dielam. Snímka o starých, životnou múdrosťou obdarených dedinčanoch žijúcich mimo modernej civilizácie bola nominovaná na Oscara v kategórii dokumentárny film (1991). V roku 1980 nakrútil Dušan Hanák romantickú drámu Ja milujem, ty miluješ. Film sa však dostal do distribúcie až v novembri 1988. O rok neskôr získala táto snímka ocenenie Strieborný medveď za najlepšiu réžiu na MFF v Berlíne a v Štrasburgu zase Hlavnú cenu a Cenu FIPRES-CI.

Psychologickú sondu do vnútra mladých žien predstavujú drámy Tichá radosť (1985) a Súkromné životy (1990), ktoré sa tiež dočkali viacerých ocenení. Medzinárodne úspešná bola aj dokumentárna snímka o vzťahu občana a totalitnej moci s názvom Papierové hlavy (1995). Z mnohých prestížnych ocenení, ktoré režisér získal doma i v zahraničí možno spomenúť Cenu za vynikajúci výkon vo filmovom umení, ktorú Dušanovi Hanákovi udelili v roku 1991 na prehliadke filmov v americkom Denveri. V roku 2004 si talentovaný tvorca prevzal štátne vyznamenanie Pribinov kríž I. triedy "za mimoriadne významné zásluhy o kultúrny rozvoj Slovenskej republiky". O dva roky neskôr putovala do jeho rúk Cena za celoživotné dielo (Award to the Career) na MFF umeleckých filmov v Bergame. Taktiež si odniesol Cenu Stredoeurópskej iniciatívy za celoživotné dielo na filmovom festivale v Terste (2011). V roku 2014 získal Cenu za výnimočný prínos svetovej kinematografii na MFF v Sofii a tiež národnú filmovú cenu Slnko v sieti za výnimočný prínos slovenskej kinematografii.

Uznávaný filmový tvorca v minulosti pôsobil ako pedagóg na Filmovej a televíznej fakulte Vysokej školy múzických umení (VŠMU) v Bratislave a podstatným spôsobom ovplyvnil nastupujúcu generáciu režisérov a režisérok. V roku 2021 sa stal Dušan Hanák laureátom ocenenia Ígric za celoživotný prínos slovenskej kinematografii. Na jeseň minulého roka si na 26. medzinárodnom festivale dokumentárnych filmov Ji.hlava prevzal ocenenie za celoživotný prínos kinematografii.

In 1969, Dušan Hanák made his debut with the feature film 322, in which the main character, in connection with his own serious diagnosis, reevaluates his previous life and values. Despite communist censorship in Czechoslovakia, the psychological drama won the Grand Prize at the International Film Festival (IFF) in Mannheim. In addition to several non-actors, leading Czech and Slovak actors Václav Lohniský, Josef Abrhám, Miroslav Macháček, František Zvarík and Polish actress Lucyna Winnicka acted in the film.

The director also achieved great success with the documentary "Pictures of the Old World" (1972), which is one of the most important films of Slovak cinematography. However, he did not receive recognition until years later, because due to ideological and aesthetic criteria, he was for a while included in the so-called treasury works. The film about the old, wisdom-endowed villagers living outside of modern civilization was nominated for an Oscar in the documentary film category (1991). It also won several foreign festival awards and the Los Angeles Film Critics Association Award (1990).

The filmmaker also won the favor of the lay and professional public with the poetic tragicomedy "Pink Dreams" (1976), which is a love story between a village postman and a beautiful Roma

girl. Juraj Nvota and Iva Bittová played the main roles.

In 1980, Dušan Hanák filmed the romantic drama "I love you, you love me". However, the film was not released until November 1988. A year later, this film won the Silver Bear award for best director at the Berlin IFF and the Main Prize and the FIPRESCI Prize in Strasbourg.


The dramas "Silent Joy" (1985) and "Private Lives" (1990), which also won several awards, provide a psychological probe into the inner world of young women. A documentary film about the relationship between citizens and totalitarian power called "Paper Heads" (1995) was also

the relationship between citizens and totalitarian power called "Paper Heads" (1995) was also internationally successful.

Among the many prestigious awards that the director received at home and abroad, we can nention the Award for outstanding performance in film art, which was awarded to Dušan Hanák in 1991 at a film festival in Denver, USA. In 2004, the talented creator received the Pribina Cross First Class "for extremely significant contributions to the cultural development of the Slovak Republic". Two years later, he received the Lifetime Achievement Award (Award to the Career) at the Bergamo Art Film Festival. He also won the Lifetime Achievement Award of the Central European Initiative at the Trieste Film Festival (2011). In 2014, he won the Award for Outstanding Contribution to World Cinema at the IFF in Sofia, as well as the National Film Award Sun in the Net for Outstanding Contribution to Slovak Cinema.

In the past, the renowned filmmaker worked as a teacher at the Film and Television Faculty of the University of Performing Arts (VŠMU) in Bratislava and significantly influenced the upcoming generation of directors. In 2021, Dušan Hanák became the laureate of the Igric award for lifetime contribution to Slovak cinematography. Last fall, at the 26th International Documentary Film Festival in Jihlava, he received an award for lifetime contribution to cinematography.
