**The Slovak Ball 2023:** Serving as Chair of The Slovak Ball, I extend my profound gratitude to the FCSU Board and Jednota members from Region 1 for their unwavering support of this gala event held in

New Jersey. The 29<sup>th</sup> annual Slovak Ball, orchestrated by the Slovak-American Cultural Center (S-ACC) at the Royal Manor in Garfield, NJ, paid a unique homage to contemporary folk music while commemorating Slovakia's 30th anniversary of independence. The evening was enriched by captivating performances of Slovak and Rusyn folk music by the charismatic Štefan Štec, accompanied by the renowned Slovak drummer and percussionist, Martin Valihora, and the live band, Express. Guests were also treated to a soulful performance of Ester Wiesnerová. The event garnered 480 attendees, inclusive of the Slovak diplomatic community, spanning across the US and even overseas, a testament to its resounding success. Thank you to Kevin Collins, FCSU Executive Secretary, who was also in attendance and presented the FSCU basket to the lucky raffle winner.

Region 1 Annual Summer Picnic: I organized the Region 1 annual picnic hosted by Branch 746 on Sunday, August 13, 2023, at the Al Kalla Park in Linden, New Jersey. The day was filled with fraternalism, great Slovak food by Julie Rada Catering, and lots of laughter. Although the weather forecast predicted a hot and humid 92 degrees, under the shadow of the walnut trees it was pleasantly cool with a slight breeze. After the delicious meal members were surprised with a special treat -- the So Delicious Ice Cream Truck, a family-owned local company, arrived with a wide selection of premium hand-churned ice creams and toppings that satisfied all kinds of sweet cravings! The afternoon concluded with the awarding of the Jednota Branch 746 Scholarships to a talented young athlete who have demonstrated scholastic excellence and community leadership.

**58**<sup>th</sup> **Anniversary of Our Lady of Sorrows Chapel:** Annually Region 1 Jednota members from New York and New Jersey travel 4 hours each way to attend this beautiful mass organized by Katherine Nowatkoski and Branch 856. This year, along with the Board, I attended the mass with the main celebrant, The Most Reverend Larry J. Kulick, J.C.L. Bishop of Greensburg, PA.

**Slovak Heritage Festival:** Amidst adverse weather conditions, the 45<sup>th</sup> Slovak Heritage Festival unfolded with remarkable resilience at the Middlesex County Fair Grounds in East Brunswick, New Jersey. Despite the cold and rain, the Slovak American community came out to support the event, the largest Slovak festival in the US. The festival, adorned with a vibrant program, featured captivating performances by renowned folklore ensembles "Litmanivky" from Litmanova, Slovakia and Šarišan from Prešov. Members of First Catholic Slovak Union Branch 746 (Linden), 716 (New York City), and 45 (New York City) were in attendance to support the event including FCSU Executive Secretary Kevin Collins, Director of the Slovak Institute in Cleveland and the Program Director of the Slovak Radio Milan Kobulsky (Branch 450). The Slovak Heritage Festival was also an opportunity for vendors to share unique Slovak and Czech made products and taste delicious homemade cuisine such as traditional brynzove halusky, grilled kolbasa, nut rolls and poppy seed rolls, and so much more!
